#### How Video Games Are Made: The Game Development Process

The game development pipeline is an industry term that refers to the process of building a video game from concept to completion. Since a game is continuously evolving, and things which sounded great in theory may not work so well in reality, a pipeline must be flexible enough to factor in revisions and course changes. It also helps manage the game development timeline and budget, reducing inefficiencies and bottlenecks.

The initial, pre-production stage defines what the game is about, why it should be made, who for, what it's going to take to make it and how it will be marketed. It can last anywhere between a week to a year, depending on the project type, resources and finances available, and typically takes up to 20% of the total production time. The information gathered during this stage forms the basis of the Game Design Document (GDD).

A GDD is a living document which helps everyone understand and get on board with the greater vision of the project. It is continuously updated and refined throughout production due to technical or financial restraints, or simply realising that things just don't look, play or work as well as you had initially hoped. A GDD keeps you organised, helps identify potential risks, and lets you see ahead of time who you may need to hire in order to bring your project to life. It also helps pitch and finance your game. Potential investors will want to see a solid plan before investing.

Prototyping happens in pre-production to test if the game idea will work, and if it is worthwhile to pursue. The team will often start with paper designs to test theories and work out many of the nuances of a game or a series of systems quickly, easily and cost effectively. The aim is to get a prototype up and running ASAP to test if the game is as fun as you had hoped. Prototyping can also reveal unexpected challenges, which could potentially change the entire course of your project. It's important to have others test your prototype too, because things that are obvious to you, may not be to others.

Placeholder assets are used to save time and money. These low-quality assets stand in for things like weapons and props during the early testing phase, and if approved, they're replaced with

final, high-quality versions afterwards. Placeholder assets can be purchased or found for free online within game development software. They're generally quite basic shapes but can also be a little more advanced.

Production is the longest stage of the pipeline, and it's all-hands-on-deck. Ranging anywhere from one to four years, production is where the game really starts to take shape. The story is refined, assets (characters, creatures, props and environments) are created, the rules of play are set, levels and worlds are built, and code is written.

The final stage of game development is game release. This is where the game is made available to the public. The team will create marketing materials, such as trailers and screenshots, to promote the game. They will also work with publishers and distribution platforms to make the game available on multiple platforms, such as consoles, PC, and mobile devices. Once the game is released, the team will continue to support it with updates and patches to fix any issues that may arise. They may also create downloadable content, such as new levels or characters, to keep players engaged with the game.

When we shop for clothes, we mostly think of numbers: How many dollars does this shirt cost? What percent discount will I get in today's sale? How many pairs of socks do I need to buy to get a deal? (0) <u>B</u> Producing one T-shirt uses about 2,700 liters of water, the same amount that the average person drinks over the course of 900 days. Every year, more than 80 billion pieces of clothing are made worldwide. After we're ready to discard a piece of clothing, three out of four end up in landfills or incinerated. And the fashion industry as a whole is the second largest polluter in the world, after oil. (1) But, for all of the claims of conscious clothing, there's not always enough useful information. So what does it really mean to be environmentally aware in the fashion world? Eco-friendly is a term that's thrown around lightly these days. It's important to understand it spans from the fabric that your clothing is made from to the factories where it is made, and eventually to those who sell and use the product. (2) Therefore, there are a few things you should consider if trying to become more aware. Ask yourself about the working conditions in the factories. Consider buying from companies that offer a way to recycle. (3) However, the plant takes a lot of water to grow, so you could choose alternatives like hemp or linen instead, which require less water to grow. But overall, natural fibers like silk, linen and wool are all better choices than synthetic materials like nylon or polyester. If you do purchase garments made with synthetic fabrics, opt for pieces that were made with recycled fibers rather than new, or 'virgin', materials. The location of factories, shipping and distribution are also important to think about. A true eco-friendly consumer knows that garments can be made in one country, with the fabric coming from another, and then dyed somewhere else. (4) \_\_\_\_\_ A responsible company will purchase carbon offsets for transportation and use recycled materials to ship their products. They will also include using renewable energy sources and donating money to environmental organizations. And finally, don't forget that companies often label their products eco-friendly even when their actual practices are really only loosely considered such. (5) \_\_\_\_ Look for

certificates which can tell you more about the company's eco-friendly practices and stay responsible beyond just your everyday recycling.
